

Figure 2: Rank Plans for the Lamprey River Elementary School in Order of Preference




Figure 3: Importance for the Town to Improve the Elementary School Facilities





Figure 4: Timeframe for When the Town Should Begin Renovating/Refurbishing or Constructing a New School

Figure 5: Rank Plans for Town Police Department in Order of Preference




Figure 6: Importance for the Town to Provide New Space for the Town Police Department





Figure 7: Timeframe for When the Town Should Begin Constructing a New Police Station or Converting the School Into One

Figure 8: Current Condition of the Roads in Raymond





Figure 9: Comes Closest to Opinion Concerning Road Maintenance

Figure 10: How Well Do You Believe Roads are Treated and Plowed During the Winter in Raymond




Figure 11: Prefer the Town Buy or Lease New Snowplows and Other Vehicles





Figure 12: Comes Closest to Opinion on What Town Should Do Regarding Snowplows and Other Vehicles

Figure 13: Importance for the Town to Install Additional Wells




Figure 14: Timeframe for When the Town Should Begin to Install Additional Wells




Figure 15: Importance for the Town to Install Sewer Facilities




Figure 16: Timeframe for when the Town Should Begin to Install Sewer Facilities





Figure 17: Likelihood of Connecting to Natural Gas if Available

Figure 18: Importance for the Town to Have a Community Center




Figure 19: Rank Options for a Community Center in Raymond





Figure 20: Timeframe for When the Town Should Address Community Center Needs

Figure 21: Importance for the Town to Improve Space for Town Offices




Figure 22: Rank Options for Town Offices in Raymond in Order of Preference





Figure 23: Timeframe for When the Town Should Improve the Available Space for Town Offices



Key Findings

Lamprey River Site

- Nearly half of residents say the LRES should be kept at its current site with the remaining residents closely divided between those who want to construct a new school at a different site and convert the building into a police station and those who want the Town and School District to stop investing in the site.

Lamprey River Elementary School

- Two-thirds of residents say it is important for the Town to improve the elementary school facilities but residents are divided on possible plans for the Lamprey River School. Just under half say their first choice is to leave the school as it currently exists while four in ten say their first choice is to construct a new elementary school at a different site.

Police Department

- A slight majority of residents say it is important for the Town to provide new space for the police department but a slight majority also say their first choice is to leave the police station as it currently exists.
- The remaining residents are divided between those who want to convert the Lamprey River Elementary School and those who want to construct a new police station.

Road Maintenance & Snow Removal

- A majority of residents describe the roads in the town as fair or poor, but less than one-third believe the Town should increase road maintenance and repair funding.
- More than three-quarters believe the roads are treated and plowed very or somewhat well during the winter.

Utilities

- Residents are divided on the Town installing additional wells to increase the town water supply and on the Town installing sewer facilities.
- Four in ten residents say they would be likely to connect to natural gas services if it were available.

Community Center

- Half of residents say it is important for the Town to have a community center to host community events and daily activities but more than three-quarters say their first choice is to continue to host community events in existing town spaces.

Town Offices

- Residents show little support for improving the available space for town offices; only three in eight say it is important for the Town to do so and nearly two-thirds say their first choice is to leave the town offices as they currently exist.
